The City of Des Moines scheduled an Administrative Hearing on November 27, 2007 at 1:00 p.m. regarding the declaration of your brown and white neutered, Pit Bull dog, (Scarface) to be a "dangerous animal" by Sergeant Scott Raudabaugh, Chief Humane Officer for the City of Des Moines Animal Control Unit.

Sergeant Raudabaugh said City Exhibit G contains a notation from Dr. Berry that he was unable to measure Mr. Fleming's dog due to the dog's aggressiveness. Sergeant Raudabaugh stated that Mr. Fleming's dog has a current City dog license and insurance, and also referred to City Exhibit I, dated April 14, 2005. On this date, Mr. Fleming's dog was picked up by Animal Control and impounded for not having a proper City license. Mr. Fleming subsequently obtained a City license and the dog was released.

Sergeant Raudabaugh referenced relevant sections of the City of Des Moines Municipal Code and said Section 18-41 refers to the definition of a vicious dog, which this dog is by breed. Section 18-196 contains the definition of a dangerous dog. Sergeant Raudabaugh stated the following two parts of this section apply in this case:

- (2) Did bite or claw once causing injuries above the shoulders of a person
- (3) Could not be controlled or restrained by the owner at the time of the attack to prevent the occurrence

Sergeant Raudabaugh then referenced Section 18-203 and said he mistakenly submitted this section into evidence, as it does not directly apply.

Section 18-202 was then discussed by Sergeant Raudabaugh and he said if his declaration of a dangerous dog is upheld, this section identifies what is to be done with the dog.

Sergeant Raudabaugh said that on November 14, 2007, Mr. Cody Fleming's dog, Scarface, was hiding under a bed while he and his girlfriend argued. At one point Mr. Fleming stepped on the dog's paw and the dog reacted by biting Mr. Fleming on the arm, causing injuries. It was reported that Mr. Fleming then punched his dog, probably in reaction to the previous bites, and the dog reacted by biting Mr. Fleming in the face. The photographs entered show the wounds. Sergeant Raudabaugh said that when the Animal Control Officer originally met with Mr. Fleming at Broadlawn's Hospital, Mr. Fleming's initial statement was untrue. A Police Officer got involved in the investigation and Mr. Fleming was then truthful by proving the correct information.

Sergeant Raudabaugh said because of the circumstances involving the bite, he declared Mr. Fleming's dog to be dangerous. Stepping on a dog's paw would probably cause some sort of reaction, but jumping up and repeatedly biting someone's arm seems unreasonable, according to Sergeant Raudabaugh. Sergeant Raudabaugh said that a dog's reaction to being punched is

undetermined but it seemed a bit unusual for the dog to jump up and bite that person in the face. Sergeant Raudabaugh said he feels this dog is a bit of a ticking time bomb. Even though Mr. Fleming contacted Sergeant Raudabaugh and asked him for a second chance for his dog, Sergeant Raudabaugh said he is concerned not only for the safety of Mr. Fleming, but for Mr. Fleming's family, friends and the citizens of Des Moines, and that is why he declared Mr. Fleming's dog to be a dangerous animal.

Cody Fleming attended the Hearing and stated he and his girlfriend were yelling and arguing pretty loudly and the dog got seared. Mr. Fleming said that when he accidentally stepped on the dog's paw, his dog bit his arm. After punching his dog, he had bent down and Mr. Fleming said he thinks the dog was going to bite him in the arm again, but bit him in the face. Mr. Fleming said at the hospital he did not want to fill out a report, but he finally said it was a neighborhood dog. He said he lied because his dog means a lot to him. Mr. Fleming said his dog is not a people-friendly dog. He said he and his girlfriend are alone most of the time and don't have many friends. Mr. Fleming said when his dog is outside he is in a body harness and there is no way the dog can get loose. Mr. Fleming said he was originally told his dog would be placed in an in-home quarantine. Mr. Fleming said he has a business and most evenings has several thousands of dollars in the home and that is why he purchased his dog.

Sergeant Raudabaugh said that on three separate occasions he went back to the dog kennel area and each time he approached the kennel, the dog growled and took a defensive stance. He said Mr. Fleming's statement that his dog is not people friendly is an accurate statement as to how the dog reacted to him each time. Dr. Berry indicated the dog reacted the same way to him and his staff. Sergeant Raudabaugh said the possibility always exists for home quarantine. From the time the initial report was made until the dog was impounded. Sergeant Raudabaugh said it gave him time to determine if home quarantine was possible. Pit Bull breed dogs are not normally home quarantined because of the liability associated with the potential of another bite and the actions taken by the Animal Control Unit would be significant.

I am ruling that Cody Fleming's Pit Bull dog named Scarface, is a dangerous dog. The reasons for this determination are as follows:

- Mr. Fleming's dog is a "vicious" dog as defined by Section 18-41.
- Mr. Fleming's dog is a "dangerous" dog as defined by Section 18-196.

- Mr. Fleming failed to control or restrain his dog at the time of the attack.
- Mr. Fleming's dog exhibited vicious propensities to the City Veterinarian and his staff and upon three occasions to Sergeant Raudabaugh.

Also, by Mr. Fleming's own admission, his dog is not a people-friendly dog and the reason he purchased him in the first place was for protection because large amounts of monies were kept in the household.

I am further ruling that Cody Fleming's Pit Bull dog, Scarface, be destroyed in a humane manner by the Chief Humane Officer.

If you disagree with this decision, you have three (3) days to appeal the decision to the City Council. The appeal must be made in writing to the City Clerk's Office, and state the reason for the appeal. If you have any questions regarding the appeal or compliance procedure, please contact Animal Control at 248-6051.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Chief of police means the legally designated chief of the police department or a designated representative.

Director of public health means the county health center director or a designated representative acting in behalf of the city.

Dog means and includes both male and female animals of the canine species.

Owner means any person owning, keeping or harboring a dog.

Vicious dog means:

- (1) Any dog which has attacked a human being or domestic animal one or more times, without provocation;
- (2) Any dog with a history, tendency or disposition to attack, to cause injury or to otherwise endanger the safety of human beings or domestic animals;
- (3) Any dog that snaps, bites, or manifests a disposition to snap or bite;
- (4) Any dog that has been trained for dog fighting, animal fighting or animal baiting or is owned or kept for such purposes;
- (5) Any dog trained to attack human beings, upon command or spontaneously in response to human activities, except dogs owned by and under the control of the police department, a law enforcement agency of the state or of the United States or a branch of the armed forces of the United States;
- (6) Staffordshire terrier breed of dog;
- (7) The American pit bull terrier breed of dog;
- (8) The American Staffordshire terrier breed of dog; or
- (9) Any dog which has the appearance and characteristics of being predominately of the breeds of Staffordshire terrier, American pit bull terrier, American Staffordshire terrier.

Dangerous animal means any animal, including a dog, except for an illegal animal per se, as listed in the definition of illegal animal, that has bitten or clawed a person while running at large and the attack was unprovoked, or any animal that has exhibited vicious propensities in present or past conduct, including such that the animal:

- (1) Has bitten or clawed a person on two separate occasions within a 12-month period;
- (2) Did bite or claw once causing injuries above the shoulders of a person;
- (3) Could not be controlled or restrained by the owner at the time of the attack to prevent the occurrence; or
- (4) Has attacked any domestic animal or fowl on three separate occasions within a 12-month period.

## illegal animal means:

- (1) Any animal which is not naturally tame or gentle and which is of a wild nature or disposition and which is capable of killing, inflicting serious injury upon or causing disease among human beings or domestic animals and having known tendencies as a species to do so.
- (2) Any animal declared to be illegal by the board of health or the city manager or his or her designee.
- (3) Any nondomesticated member of the order Carnivora which as an adult exceeds the weight of 20 pounds.
- (4) The following animals, which shall be deemed to be illegal animals per se:
  - a. Lions, tigers, jaguars, leopards, cougars, lynx and bobcats.
  - b. Wolves, coyotes and foxes.
  - c. Badgers, wolverines, weasels, skunks and mink.
  - d. Raccoons.
  - e. Bears.
  - Monkeys and chimpanzees.
  - g. Bats.
  - Alligators, crocodiles and caimans.
  - i. Scorpions.
  - Snakes and reptiles that are venomous.
  - k. Snakes that are constrictors over six feet in length.
  - I. Gila monsters.
  - m. Opossums.
  - All apes, baboons and macaques.
  - o. Piranhas.

## Sec. 18-203. Immediate seizure or destruction of animals.

Any animal found at large which displays dangerous tendencies, or which is an illegal animal, or which has been previously declared vicious or is vicious by breed according to article II, section 18-41 (6), (7), (8), or (9) of this chapter and has bitten without provocation a person or a domestic animal while such vicious dog was not properly confined or leashed may be processed as a dangerous animal under section 18-202 of this article, and the animal may be immediately seized anywhere within the city unless the animal is so dangerous that it cannot safely be apprehended, in which case the chief humane officer, his or her designee, or any police officer is authorized to destroy it immediately.

# Sec. 18-202. Seizure, impoundment and disposition of dangerous animals.

- (a) The chief humane officer or his or her designee, In his or her discretion or upon receipt of a complaint alleging that a particular animal is a dangerous animal as defined in this article, may initiate proceedings to declare such animal a dangerous animal. A hearing on the matter shall be conducted by the city manager or his or her designee. The person owning, keeping, sheltering, or harboring the animal in question shall be given not less than 72 hours' written notice of the time and place of the hearing. The notice shall set forth the description of the animal in question and the basis for the allegation of dangerousness. The notice shall also set forth that if the animal is determined to be dangerous it may be ordered destroyed or the owner may be given the option to cause it to be destroyed. The notice shall be served upon any adult residing at the premises where the animal is located or may be posted on those premises if no adult is present to accept service. A notice that a dog is a dangerous animal mayinclude as an alternative an allegation that a dog is a vicious dog under sections 18-41 and 18-59 of this chapter, and the hearings shall proceed together under this section.
- (b) If, after hearing, the city manager or his or her designee determines that an animal is dangerous, the city manager or his or her designee shall either order the animal destroyed in a humane manner by the chief human officer, or order the person owning, sheltering, harboring or keeping the animal to cause it to be destroyed in a humane manner. The order shall immediately be served upon the individual or entity against whom issued in the same manner as the notice of hearing. If the animal is ordered to be destroyed by the chief humane officer such order shall be carried out after the appeal period in subsection (c) of this section has expired. If the animal is ordered to be destroyed by the owner, such order must be complied with within three days of its issuance, otherwise the city manager or his or her designee is authorized to seize and impound the animal. An animal so seized shall be impounded for a period of seven days. If, at the end of the impoundment period, the individual or entity against whom the order of the city manager or his or her designee was issued has not appealed such order to the city council, the city manager or his or her designee shall cause the animal to be destroyed in a humane manner.
- (c) The order to destroy a dangerous animal Issued by the city manager or his or her designee may be appealed to the city council. In order to appeal such order, written notice of appeal must be filed with the city clerk within three days after receipt of the order to destroy the dangerous animal. Failure to file such written notice of appeal shall constitute a waiver of the right to appeal the order of the city manager or his or her designee.
- (d) The notice of appeal shall state the grounds for such appeal and shall be delivered personally or by certified mail to the city clerk. The hearing of such appeal shall be scheduled within seven days of the receipt of notice of appeal. The hearing may be continued for good cause. The hearing shall be confined to the record made before the city manager or his or her designee and the arguments of the parties or their representatives, but no additional evidence shall be taken. After such hearing the city council may affirm or reverse the order of the city manager or his or her designee. Such determination shall be contained in a written decision and shall be filed with the city clerk within three days after the hearing or any continued session thereof.
- (e) If the city council affirms the action of the city manager or his or her designee, the city council shall either order the animal destroyed by the chief humane officer, or order that the individual or entity owning, sheltering, harboring, or keeping such dangerous animal shall cause it to be destroyed in a humane manner. The decision and order shall immediately be served upon the person or entity against whom rendered in the same manner as the order to destroy. If the animal is ordered to be destroyed by the chief humane officer the order shall be effective on the fourth day after receipt of the order by the owner unless the county district court has been petitioned to review the order within the first three days after receipt. If the animal is ordered to be destroyed by the owner and such order is not appealed to the county district court and is not

complied with within three days after receipt of the order by the owner, the chief humane officer or his or her designee is authorized to seize and impound suchdangerous animal. An animal so seized shall be impounded for a period of seven days. If, at the end of the impoundment period, the individual or entity against whom the decision and order of the city council was issued has not petitioned the county district court for a review of the order, the city manager or his or her designee shall cause the animal to be destroyed in a humane manner.

- (f) Failure to comply with an order of the city manager or his or her designee issued pursuant to this section and not appealed or of the city council after appeal shall constitute a misdemeanor offense.
- (g) Any animal which is alleged to be dangerous and which is under impoundment or quarantine at the animal shelter shall not be released to the owner, but shall continue to be held at the expense of the owner pending the outcome of the hearing. All costs of such impoundment or quarantine shall be paid by the owner if the animal is determined to be dangerous. If the animal is not determined to be dangerous and was found at large, the owner shall only pay those costs attributable to the initial confinement and any required quarantine. If the animal is not determined to be dangerous and was not at large at the time of confinement, the owner shall only pay those costs attributable to any required quarantine.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING TRANSCRIPT

November 27, 2007 City v. Fleming Dangerous Animal

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Good afternoon. My name is LeAnn Ducey and I'm an Administrative Hearing Officer. It is 1:00 p.m. on November 27, 2007 and we are conducting an administrative hearing on a dangerous dog declaration. The appellant is Cody Fleming. When I call you to give testimony today, please come up to the podium, speak into the microphone and state your full name and address for the record. You will then be sworn in. This is an informal hearing and to that matter the hearing is now open. Would the representative from the City please come forward, identify yourself and present any information you have pertaining to this hearing.

SERGEANT SCOTT RAUDABAUGH: My name is Scott Raudabaugh. I am a Des Moines Police Sergeant assigned as the Supervisor of the Animal Control Unit and by City ordinance the Chief Humane Officer for the City of Des Moines.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Please raise your right hand. Do you Sergeant Scott Raudabaugh, swear or affirm the testimony you are about to give is the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?

SERGEANT SCOTT RAUDABAUGH: Yes.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Go ahead.

SERGEANT SCOTT RAUDABAUGH: I'd like to first start out by, uh, submitting copies of relevant documents and also photographs of the, of the victim.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay.

SERGEANT SCOTT RAUDABAUGH: That was bit.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Thank you. I'll enter these as City Exhibit A.

SERGEANT SCOTT RAUDABAUGH: I've got two additional sets of the same documents I provided to you. One is my copy so to speak and the other one I'll leave up here on the podium for Mr. Fleming to look at if he chooses.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay.

SERGEANT SCOTT RAUDABAUGH: I'd like to just kinda go through these documents for, for clarity on what they are. The, uh, first document is a copy of the dangerous animal declaration letter that was served on Mr. Fleming. The, uh, second is a document service form that indicates that it was served and the, next four pages are the initial animal bite report that was

made on Case No. 07-44453. The next two are a supplemental report, uh, completed after a follow-up investigation. The, uh, next document is a supplemental report, uh, created by a technician that is assigned to the identification section. The next document is a request for development of photographs. Then the next document is a form completed by the City veterinarian, the current City veterinarian, uh, evaluating the breed of the dog which indicates it's a, it's of the vicious dog breed. I do need to point out that when Dr. Greg Berry evaluated the dog, he made mention of, towards the bottom of that form, that he was unable to measure the dog because of the dog's behavior and, and it's aggressiveness towards him and his staff. After that is a, documents from the City Clerk's Office relevant to licensing of the dog. I checked and found that Mr. Fleming does in fact have a 2007 license on the dog. It appears it was, it was possibly issued January 24, 2007. Uhm, a few days late, but he does have an '07 license and the insurance is good. After that is a, what is previously referred to as animal history reports that were completed on April 14, 2005 in which this dog was impounded because it was not properly licensed in the City of Des Moines as a vicious dog. Uh. and, Mr. Fleming, after the dog was impounded, did comply with the City ordinance and license the dog before getting it out of the animal shelter. After that, uh, is copies of various relevant City ordinances. I'll just refer to some of them and read others. 18-41 refers to the definition of a vicious dog which this dog is by breed. Uh, and also this current bite, it could qualify as, by behavior I believe as well. 18-196 refers to uh, it has two definitions. One for dangerous animal and, and secondly for illegal animal. The illegal doesn't apply in this case. However, uh, dangerous I believe does. I'm gonna read through this. Dangerous animal means any animal, including a dog, except for an illegal animal per se, as listed in the definition of illegal animal, that has bitten or clawed a person while running at large and the attack was unprovoked, or any animal that has exhibited vicious propensities in present or past conduct, including such that: (1) the animal has bitten or clawed a person on two separate occasions within a 12-month period; (2) did bite or claw once causing injuries above the shoulders of a person which no. 2 applies in this case; (3) could not be controlled or restrained by the owner at the time of the attack to prevent the occurrence which I believe also applies in this case; or (4) has attacked any domestic animal or fowl on three separate occasions within a 12-month period. The next ordinance is 18-203 which talks about immediate seizure or destruction of animals relevant to the dangerous animal section of the code. There's certainly points of 18-203 that, that can also apply. I'll read through that. Any animal found at large which displays dangerous tendencies, or which is an illegal animal, or which has been previously declared vicious or is vicious by breed according to Article II, Section 18(41)(6), (7), (8), or (9) of this Chapter and has bitten without provocation a person or a domestic animal while such vicious dog was not properly confined or leashed may be processed as a dangerous animal under section 18-202 of this article, and the animal may be immediately seized anywhere within the city unless the animal is so dangerous that it cannot safely be apprehended, in which case the chief humane officer, his or her designee, or any police officer is authorized to destroy it immediately. I misspoke, it doesn't actually apply in this case. Uh, I mistakenly put it in with the documents, but certainly stepping back the definition of a dangerous animal under 18-196 does apply. I apologize for submitting that erroneously, 18-202 talks about seizure impoundment and disposition of dangerous animals. It, it applies in this case as to if you uphold my declaration what is to be done with the dog.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay,

SERGEANT SCOTT RAUDABAUGH: The reason we're here is on November 14, 2007 Mr. Cody Fleming's brown and white colored pit bull breed dog named Scarface was hiding under a bed while he and his girlfriend argued. It was presented that at one point, uh, Mr. .Fleming stepped on the dog's paw and the dog reacted by attacking and biting Mr. Fleming's arm which caused injuries. It was reported that, uh, Mr. Floming, uh, then punched his dog, probably in reaction to the previous bite and the dog then reacted by attacking and biting Mr. Fleming's face. Both of these bites caused injuries. One to Mr. Fleming's arm and also to his face. I've submitted photographs that were taken by the identification technician that indicate various bites, various, uh, uh, puncture wounds to Mr. Fleming's arms and, uh, lacerations to Mr. Fleming's face that as you can see in the photographs were sutured. I also need to make mention that initially it, uh, when the animal control officer met with Mr. Fleming at Broadlawn's Hospital, Mr. Fleming was, uh, uh, not quite truthful in the initial report. Uhm, subsequently a police officer got involved in assisting in the investigation and Mr. Fleming then was truthful in his, uh, providing his information to us and to the animal control officer as to what happened. Uhm, because of the circumstances of the bite, uhm, I declared it dangerous. Uh, it seems reasonable that, uh, stepping on a dog's paw might cause the dog to yelp or run away or maybe bite a person's leg, any of those things, uh. seem reasonable, but to a jump up and bite somebody's arm and, and uh, bite it repeatedly and, uh, then when Mr. Fleming punched the dog, uh, how a dog reacts to being punched is, is a, is undetermined. Uhm, however, it does seem a bit unusual that a, that a dog would then jump up and bite somebody in the face after being punched. Once again, it seems, it seems very reasonable that a dog after being punched would yelp, run away, maybe bite the person in the arm. Maybe bite the person in the leg. Uh, any variety of thing, but to jump up and bite Mr. Fleming in the face seems, uh, seems a bit unusual. Uh, these two bite occurrences, uh, indicate to me that this dog is a, is a bit of a ticking time bomb. Uh, Mr. Fleming has called and, and called me and expressed his concern for the dog and, and wanted his dog back and, and begged for a second chance and I can appreciate his love of his dog. Uhm, but I feel it's necessary not only to protect him from his own dog but to protect his family and friends and, and all the citizens of Des Moines and that is the reason I declared the dog be a dangerous animal.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay, Thank you.

SERGEANT SCOTT RAUDABAUGH: That's all I have at this point. Thank you.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Mr. Fleming, Please state your name and address.

CODY FLEMING: My name is Cody Allen Fleming. Address 6509 S.W. 16<sup>th</sup> Street, Des Moines, Iowa, 50315.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Please raise your right hand. Do you Cody Fleming, swear or affirm the testimony you are about to give is the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?

CODY FLEMING: Yes I do.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Do you want to take a minute to look at those papers?

CODY FLEMING: Uh, I, I can browse them.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay, Okay,

CODY FLEMING: I, I just have one, uhm, one, one thing on the a dangerous report that, or, or this sheet, I'm sorry.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay.

CODY FLEMING: I, I'm real nervous.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: That's okay.

CODY FLEMING: Uh, I, I don't know if its miscommunication between us. There's only one problem. When the dog, what exactly happened, me and my girl we were, we were arguing. We were velling pretty loud.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Uhm, uh.

CODY FLEMING: The dog got scared and it was underneath the bed and when I stepped on his paw I was by my bed and, uh, when he came up I went to move away from him, like, laying, kinda like on my bed like this and he came up and bit my arm.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay.

CODY FLEMING: The moment he bit my arm I swung at him and, I, I think he'd released by the time I actually punched him but when he came back, he went back for the same arm, but I was in this kind of a state and I moved my arm. He bit my face. The moment he bit my face he released. I picked him up like this and put him in the bathroom.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay.

CODY FLEMING: Uh, when I arrived at Broadlawn's, uhm, I didn't want to fill out a report. I did not want to do none of that. I a, the guy came in and I told him it was a neighborhood dog. I did lie. I lied cause my dog means a lot to me.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Right.

CODY FLEMING: And, uh, he called the policeman in. The officer came in there. He was extremely disrespectful. I called his sergeant and turned him in. Uh, made a report on him. His sergeant said he would have a talk with him. I was getting sutured. The police officer told me he could not wait 10 minutes for my face to get a stitch before he talked to me. I. I told him I didn't want to talk. I said do I not have, do I just not have any rights just to not, or, don't I have the right to just not say anything right now and he told me no that I didn't have that right. And he said you got, you better tell them right now or you're going to jail. The animal control officer turned over to me and said look if it was your dog he will get a 10-day in-home quarantine and I

said alright. And right there I told him the truth, the whole story. That dog, I, he is not a people friendly dog. Uhm, I'm pretty much a loner. Me and my girlfriend don't have many friends. Stay at home all day. There is no one else in the house but my girlfriend but me. Uh, the dog, he, he has never got loose from me before. When he goes outside he's on a body harness. He's, there's no way for him to get loose from me and believe it or not he actually did, he actually does listen to me very well. Uhm, uh, he's, he's never done this before, never acted like that. Uhm, after they told me the 10-day in-home quarantine, the animal control officer said will you be there later on this afternoon and I'll come by and check on him and I said yea I'll be there all day so come by. He didn't come over until at like 20, after 24 hours after the dog bite happened, the next morning to take my dog. And I was extremely upset with that beings I was lied to by him. Uh, I, I

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: I understand

CODY FLEMING: I, he, I mean he's a pit, he isn't blood thirsty, I mean he, he isn't people friendly. I, I run a business. I, I have large amounts of cash on me, \$3-4,000 every night and that is the main reason I got that dog is I can leave him at home with the money for the work. I mean I did not raise him to be like that. He does not, he ain't a fighting dog. I mean that's just how he is. Uh,

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: It was an un, unfortunate set of circumstances I think that brought you here today. Uhm, I'm sure it scared the dog when you, when you stepped on it. Uhm, I understand. Do you have anything else to present today? Okay. Sergeant Raudabaugh, do you have anything? Okay.

SERGEANT SCOTT RAUDABAUGH: Uh, I forgot.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I'm sorry (Inaudible).

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Oh, you, you need to come up to the mic. Why don't you let Sergeant Raudabaugh speak and then you can speak again. Go ahead.

SERGEANT SCOTT RAUDABAUGH: Uh, I forgot to mention earlier that on three different occasions I went back to the dog kennel area and each time I approached the dog kennel that Mr. Fleming's dog was in the dog immediately, uhm, growled and took a defensive stance. Certainly Mr. Fleming's comment about the dog not being people friendly was a good, accurate statement as to how the dog reacted to me each and every time and also from the notations on the, on the veterinarian's dog breed evaluation form that the dog reacted the same to, to him and his staff. As far as something else that Mr. Fleming said as far as the home quarantine, uhm, the possibility always exists for possible home quarantine.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay.

SERGEANT SCOTT RAUDABAUGH: Uh, from the time the initial report was made, uhm, until the dog was impounded, it gave time for me to evaluate the report, the information available, and determine whether a home quarantine was possible. Uh, pit bull breed dogs are not commonly home quarantined because of all the liability associated with the potential of home quarantine and if they were not to be kept under quarantine and another bite were to occur, uh, the liability and, and a scrutiny of the animal control units actions would be, uhm, significant. Uhm, often times pit bulls are kept in quarantine in the animal control shelter for a multitude of reasons but those are just a few of them. Uhm, rarely are they left for home quarantine.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay.

SERGEANT SCOTT RAUDABAUGH: In this case, Mr. Fleming was at the hospital when the animal control officer left. Uhm, and subsequently there was follow-up done and the dog was impounded after that.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay. Thank you.

SERGEANT SCOTT RAUDABAUGH: Thank you.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Mr. Fleming.

CODY FLEMING: I just want to say that that, that was the main reason why I, I, I lied in the first place at the hospital was because I knew that if he was quarantined with them because my grandma has a, a half pit bull breed dog and, uh, it a, they took him from her and he went through some kind of test to declare not vicious. I, I don't know.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Probably by the vet. The veterinarian exams them I think to see the breed.

CODY FLEMING: And, uh, I knew that if he went down there because we do have a kennel at home and anybody he don't know and walks up to the kennel he's trapped. He don't have nowhere to go. He gets scared and, uh, I mean, I know him, he'd probably do that outside the kennel to this guy. He don't know him but he does act like that in the kennel and, uh, that's, oh, and, and he also when they took him from me the first time when I went down there, that was days after I received the dog and I was looking to know what I need to do to keep him. It wasn't that there was a problem and they took him.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY; Was the dog running at large that first time?

CODY FLEMING: No. That dog has never, ever been off, he's never been 6 feet away from me off a leash.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay.

CODY FLEMING: He was taken down there cause I didn't know what steps you needed go through to get him licensed.

# HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay. Okay.

CODY FLEMING: That's it now.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay. Thank you. Anyone else have anything to present? Okay. Uh, I was presented with a, a quite a bit of, quite a few documents to look over and so I'm not going to make a decision today. Uhm, these cases I like to be very thorough before I do any kind of a ruling. So, uhm, I will be sending a written ruling which would be hand delivered to you. Uhm, I hope by Thursday of this week. And, uhm, upon receipt of that, that will be my final administrative decision. Should you disagree with the decision, you do have the right to file a written appeal within three days to appear before the City Council and there would be documentation in that stating how you needed to handle that. But like I said, I want to review everything very thoroughly before I make any kind of a decision. So with that the hearing is over for today. Thank you both for coming in.
