**NOTICE OF IMPOUNDMENT
DES MOINES, IOWA POLICE DEPARTMENT**

SHOULD YOU REQUEST AN ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING, YOU MAY RECLAIM YOUR MOTOR VEHICLE BY POSTING A BOND IN AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT TO COVER ALL CHARGES ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE IMPOUNDMENT AND STORAGE OF THE VEHICLE. IF AT THE HEARING, THE HEARING OFFICER DETERMINES THERE WAS NO PROBABLE CAUSE TO IMPOUND THE VEHICLE, THE BOND SHALL BE REFUNDED UPON PRESENTATION TO THE CITY TREASURER OF A CERTIFICATE OF NO PROBABLE CAUSE AND THE BOND RECEIPT. SHOULD YOU NOT REQUEST A HEARING; YOU MAY CLAIM YOUR MOTOR VEHICLE FROM THE IMPOUNDMENT CONTRACTOR UPON PAYMENT OF ALL CHARGES ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE IMPOUNDMENT AND STORAGE OF THE VEHICLE. THIS IS ONLY A RELEASE, WHICH ENTITLES YOU TO CLAIM YOUR VEHICLE, AND ANY PERSONAL PROPERTY CONTAINED WITHIN FROM THE TOWING CONTRACTOR. THE VEHICLE AND ANY PERSONAL PROPERTY CONTAINED WITHIN IS NOT CONSIDERED CLAIMED UNTIL ALL TOWING AND STORAGE FEES ARE PAID TO THE TOWING CONTRACTOR. THE ISSUANCE OF THIS RELEASE DOES NOT AUTOMATICALLY STOP THE ACCRUAL OF STORAGE FEES.

Marnie Strate appeared in her own behalf, as the title holder of record of a 2008 red 4-door Chevy Aveo (Iowa 2011 license FNCYLDY). Officer Natale Chiodo, with the Des Moines Police Department (the "DMPD"), appeared on behalf of the City of Des Moines (the "City").

Procedural History

At approximately 9:14 PM on July 22, 2011, Officer Chiodo observed a 2008 red 4-door Chevy Aveo (Iowa 2011 license FNCYLDY) parked in the 100 block of 3rd Street in Des Moines, Polk County, Iowa; an area which had been posted "emergency no parking." Officer Chiodo identified the owner as Marnie Strate; issued Citation No. 7056875 for violation of Section 114-361.17 of the City of Des Moines Municipal Code (the "Municipal Code"); and ordered the vehicle and its contents be impounded. At approximately 9:58 PM on July 22, 2011, G&S Service, Inc/City Wide Towing towed the vehicle in question to impound. At approximately 4:11 PM on July 23, 2011, the DMPD authorized the release of Ms. Strate's vehicle after she paid the DMPD impound fee; also informing her of her right to request an administrative hearing to contest the impound of her vehicle provided her request was filed with the City Clerk within 10-days. On July 27, 2011, Ms. Strate's request for an administrative hearing was filed with the City Clerk. On July 28, 2011, the City Clerk sent a letter to Ms. Strate noting an administrative hearing had been scheduled for 9:30 AM on August 8, 2011. The matter was so heard before the Administrative Hearing Officer.

Discussion

The issue is whether there was probable cause to impound Ms. Strate's 2008 red 4-door Chevy Aveo (Iowa 2011 license FNCYLDY) on July 22, 2011. Section 114-485.17 of the Municipal Code states:

"[T]he term 'probable cause to impound' shall mean such a state of facts as would lead a person of ordinary care and prudence to believe there was a breach of law for which the vehicle may be removed and impounded under section 114-485.11 of this article.

Officer Chiodo testified that at approximately 8:00 PM on July 22, 2011 he went on duty with the DMPD "Push Unit," which is charged with maintaining order in the downtown area. Officer Chiodo testified that because of previous problems in the area the DMPD had placed "Emergency No Parking" bags on the 3rd Street parking meters south of Court Avenue all the way to MLK Parkway starting at approximately 5:15 PM on July 22, 2011. Officer Chiodo testified that "farmers market no parking bags" had initially been placed over the meters at approximately 4:45 PM that day in preparation for the weekly Saturday downtown farmers market. Officer Chiodo testified that at approximately 8:15 PM on July 22, 2011, he began impounding all vehicles parked along 3rd Street between Court Avenue and MLK Parkway and

issuing citations under Section 114-361.17 of the Municipal Code. Section 114-361.17 of the Municipal Code provides:

- (a) The chief of police may, upon issuance of an emergency order, cause temporary no parking signs to be posted on or about streets of the city. No person shall park in violation of signs so posted.
- (b) A person who violates any provision of this section shall pay a fine of \$15.00.

Ms. Strate testified that she is an employee at Court Avenue Restaurant and Brewing and had parked her car at approximately 5:00 PM on Friday, July 22, 2011 in a spot along 3rd Street at a meter with a "farmers market no parking bag" on it when she went to work. Ms. Strate testified that she was very familiar with the restrictions imposed by the "farmers market no parking bags" given she works in the vicinity; noting she knew parking was prohibited on Saturdays from 5:00 AM through 1:00 PM in order to accommodate the downtown farmers market. Ms. Strate testified that she discovered her vehicle was gone when she got off work at 2:10 AM on Saturday, July 23, 2011.

Officer Chiodo testified that some of the "emergency no parking bags" on the parking meters along 3rd Street between Court Avenue and MLK Parkway had been removed, conjecturing most likely by individuals. Officer Chiodo testified that vehicles parked at unbagged meters were still impounded for safe keeping because the whole street had been declared no parking; noting however that no citations were issued in such circumstances. Officer Chiodo testified that to the best of his recollection Ms. Strate's vehicle had not been parked at a meter where the bag had been removed.

Given the declaration of "emergency no parking" appears to be in response to problems previously experienced during the weekends in the Court Avenue District, it is unfortunate that the DMPD did not notify all businesses in the area in a timely manner so their staff could have been made aware of the change in parking restrictions. It seems reasonable for restaurant employees in the Court Avenue District to be parking their vehicles on the street and yet it seems unreasonable to expect those employees to have time on a busy Friday night to closely monitor whether there was a change in the parking restrictions in the vicinity during their shift. While bagging meters may mitigate one type of problem it may also create another problem for an employee who finds herself on the street at 2:00 AM with no vehicle. Furthermore, it appears there should have been a coordinated effort by DMPD to ensure two separate and distinct "no parking" bags, which were both authorized by the Chief of Police, were not placed on the same meters with conflicting restrictions within such a relatively short period of time. Also it would have been prudent for the meters to be bagged earlier in the afternoon before patrons and employees started parking in the area for the evening.

However as noted above and as provided under Section 114-485.16 of the Municipal Code, the sole issue that may be considered at hearing is whether probable cause did exist on July 22, 2011 when Officer Chiodo ordered Ms. Strate's 2008 red 4-door Chevy Aveo (Iowa 2011 license FNCYLDY) and its contents to be impounded. Officer Chiodo testified that he: (1) was aware of prior problems in the downtown area that may be alleviated by prohibiting parking during the weekends; (2) was aware the Chief of Police declared 3rd Street from Court Avenue to MLK Parkway "emergency no parking" and so ordered the meters be bagged beginning at approximately 5:15 PM on July 22, 2011; (3) was dispatched at approximately 8:15 PM on July 22, 2011 to impound all vehicles that remained parked along the restricted stretch of 3rd Street; and (4) impounded Ms. Strate's 2008 red 4-door Chevy Aveo (Iowa 2011 license FNCYLDY)

because it was parked in the 100 block of 3rd Street at 9:14 PM on July 22, 2011 in violation of Section 114-361.17 of the Municipal Code.

Decision and Order

By a preponderance of all evidence in the record, it is found that a person of ordinary care and prudence would be led to believe probable cause did exist when Officer Chiodo caused Ms. Strate's vehicle and its contents to be impounded. Marnie Strate is therefore held liable and ordered to pay all charges, costs and fees attributable to the impound and storage of her vehicle, as well as the fifteen dollar (\$15) fine for Citation No. 7056875, plus any related late fees.

Right of Appeal

As provided under Section 114-485.18 of the Municipal Code, this decision may be appealed to the City Council by either the department causing the vehicle to be impounded or the registered owner or person having legal entitlement to possession of the impounded vehicle, provided a written notice of appeal is filed with the City Clerk's Office within seven days of this decision. Failure to file a written notice of appeal within such period shall be deemed a waiver of the right to appeal this decision to the City Council.

This written ruling is hereby submitted on this 11th day of August, 2011 in Des Moines, Polk County, Iowa. The City Clerk shall serve copies of this Decision and Order upon each of the parties.

To whom it may concern -

I am writing to request that the City Council or the Des Moines Police Department reverse the decision made in regards to my administrative hearing on 8/8/2011, in regards to my vehicle being towed and impounded on 7/22/2011 (case # 23449). While the decision and order in response to my appeal states that "probable cause" existed for Officer Natale Chiodo to impound my vehicle, I believe there was a failure on the part of the city to provide proper notice that there would be no parking on 320 St South of Court Avenue that night. I parked at approximately 4:15 PM the evening of 7/22, and there was only a "Farmers market - no parking 5AM-1PM Saturday" hood on the meter. As a downtown employee, I am very familiar with these hoods, and parked there believing to be parked legally. There was no indication whatsoever at that point in time that it would later become an "emergency - no parking" space. I believe I did my due diligence in attempting to abide by the parking laws. Furthermore, officer Chiodo stated in the hearing that he was not certain that the "emergency - no parking" hood was even on the meter at the time my car was towed. I ask that the city waive my \$15 parking ticket fee as well as reimburse me for the \$53.92 I spent getting my vehicle back. Thank you for your time and consideration.

ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING TRANSCRIPT

August 8, 2011

City v. Strate

Vehicle Impound

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: Good morning. It is approximately 9:25 a.m. on Monday, August 8, 2011 and my name is Camille Valley and I'm the Administrative Hearing Officer. We're conducting this hearing this morning at the request of Marnie Strate regarding the City's impound of a vehicle. Would the City representative please come to the microphone. I want to make note for the record that we're recording this hearing this morning and so if you could please state your name and the title of your position for the record.

SENIOR POLICE OFFICER NATALE CHIODO: Yes ma'am. Officer Natale Chiodo. Senior Police Officer employed with the City of Des Moines.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: Would you please raise your right hand. Do you solemnly swear or affirm that the testimony you are about to give is the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?

SENIOR POLICE OFFICER NATALE CHIODO: I do.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: Okay. You may proceed and share with me the facts and circumstances of this case.

SENIOR POLICE OFFICER NATALE CHIODO: On July 22nd at 2000 hours at 8:00 p.m., I was employed as a police officer for the City of Des Moines and I was working part of a unit called the Push Unit. My job was to go downtown and kind of maintain order in the business district. Because of the problems we've been experiencing downtown, in some meetings that I had attended, we had bagged the meters south of Court Avenue on Third all the way to MLK and the meters had been bagged "emergency no parking". There was a bag over the meter initially that was for the farmers' market that is there every week for Friday and Saturday and that had been placed on the meters at about 4:45 in the afternoon and then the City had gone and had a couple of people put the "emergency no parking" bags over the meters shortly after that within 15 minutes or half an hour after that. I believe Officer Garth House and Officer Chris Latcham are the ones that put "emergency no parking" meters, or bags over the meters. Shortly after I got out of roll call, between I'd say 8:30 and 9:00 o'clock, I went downtown and impounded all the vehicles that were parked at the meters between Court Avenue and MLK. Some of the bags had been removed from the meters. I'm not sure if private people had removed the bags, but there was no parking along the whole street so I impounded the vehicle and wrote a citation.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: And what section of the code did you cite this under?

SENIOR POLICE OFFICER NATALE CHIODO: Uh, it was 114-361.17 I believe. No parking emergency.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: Okay 361. What was the last of that?

SENIOR POLICE OFFICER NATALE CHIODO: .17.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: Okay. Anything further?

SENIOR POLICE OFFICER NATALE CHIODO: Some of the bags had been, every weekend that we've done this some of the bags have been removed. Usually if we get to a meter where someone has removed the bags because the whole street's no parking, what we do is we impound the car for safekeeping and it doesn't get the citation. So we've just been impounding every car that's parked at the meters.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: So it was this, the car in question then, is it one of the ones that was at a meter that....

SENIOR POLICE OFFICER NATALE CHIODO: To the best of my knowledge it was parked at a meter that had a yellow bag taped around it that said "emergency no parking".

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: Okay. So it wasn't one of the ones just for safekeeping that no citation was written obviously because you wrote a citation?

SENIOR POLICE OFFICER NATALE CHIODO: Correct.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: Okay. Alright. Anything further?

SENIOR POLICE OFFICER NATALE CHIODO: No ma'am.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: Okay. Thank you. Ms. Strate would you like to come to the microphone and clearly state your name for the record?

MARNIE STRATE: Marnie Strate.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: Okay. Would you please raise your right hand? Do you solemnly swear or affirm that the testimony you are about to give is the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?

MARNIE STRATE: I do.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: Okay. You may proceed and share with me anything you'd like me to consider.

MARNIE STRATE: Okay. Uhm, I arrived on said Friday. I don't have my ticket in front of me. I believe it was the 23rd.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: The 22nd is what....

MARNIE STRATE: The 22nd. Yes, that's correct. That Friday. For my, I work at Court Avenue Restaurant and Brewery. I arrived about 4:15 p.m. and parked at a meter that had

a farmers' market "no parking 5:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m." bag on it. Uhm, I worked until 2:00 a.m. that morning and when I arrived to get to my car it had already been towed and there was no longer a bag. There was never, I never saw the meter with an "emergency no parking" bag on it.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: So the only thing you saw was the farmers' market bag?

MARNIE STRATE: Right. To the best of my knowledge I was allowed to park there.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: And you are used to seeing those I presume since you work down there?

MARNIE STRATE: Yes I am.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: Okay. Anything else you'd like to say.

MARNIE STRATE: I think that's all I have.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: I know nothing about these cases until I hear them so I deliberate on the testimony I've heard and evidence I've received and so I will develop a final written ruling which I submit to the City Clerk's Office and she'll make sure you get a copy.

MARNIE STRATE: Olay.

HEARING OFFICER CAMILLE VALLEY: So I thank you very much for your time and testimony this morning and this case is adjourned.
