RE: 2011 Neighborhood Selection

Over the last several months, the Neighborhood Revitalization Board has been actively engaged with staff in the neighborhood selection process. This year, applications were accepted from Recognized neighborhoods as well as from Charter neighborhoods. At two special meetings on October 12th and 13th, 2011, the Board heard presentations from the seven Recognized and seven Charter neighborhoods that submitted applications. The Recognized neighborhood applicants included Grays Lake, Historic East Village, Lower Beaver, Martin Luther King Jr. Park, Sheridan Gardens, Southwestern Hills, and Valley High Manor. The Charter neighborhood applicants included Beaverdale, Capitol East, Capitol Park, Fairgrounds, Gray's Woods, River Bend, and Woodland Heights.

At our meeting on November 2, 2011, the Neighborhood Revitalization Board considered two recommendations from staff. First, to select three Recognized neighborhoods to become Designated under the Neighborhood Revitalization Program: Lower Beaver, Grays Lake, and Martin Luther King Jr. Park. In addition, staff recommended opening NFC lending to the entire Sheridan Gardens neighborhood for a period of two years. Second, to select five Charter neighborhoods for a pilot program to update their original plans: Beaverdale, Woodland Heights, Capitol East, Capitol Park, and River Bend. Staff suggested that River Bend go through a special neighborhood-led planning process, given the professional expertise and ability of members of the neighborhood association.

The Board approved both staff recommendations as written, and is pleased to forward them on to City Council and the Polk County Board of Supervisors for consideration.

Thank you for your continued support of and commitment to improving Des Moines through the Neighborhood Revitalization Program.
