Re: Big Yellow Bike, L.L.C.

Dear Mayor and City Council Members:



Big Yellow Bike L.L.C. (David Welch, 4403 64th Street, Urbandale, Iowa 50322) is proposing to introduce a 16-passenger bike to the City of Des Moines, offering residents and visitors another means by which to view and experience downtown. The bike is currently under construction in Amsterdam, with delivery anticipated in six weeks. The company will do pre-planned tours and also customized routes. Areas proposed for tours include Court Avenue, East Village, Principal Park, Farmer's Market, and others. In late March, Mr. Welch approached staff to share his plans and also learn of permitting processes and other City requirements. Staff has conducted this research and the information has been provided below. Mr. Welch has been invited to present his concept to City Council. Council action is not required.

Nationwide, several cities have seen the launch of multi-passenger bikes, but this would be the first in Iowa. The City of Des Moines has a reputation as a sustainable community that looks for creative ways to welcome people to its downtown, making tours on a multi-passenger bike an exciting new way to see the many historic, cultural, and recreational sites and business offerings that are here.

Traffic and Transportation has reviewed City ordinances, including the recently adopted Bicycle Ordinance, and also consulted with the Police Department on the multipassenger bike. Mr. Welch intends for the Big Yellow Bike to be alcohol free, which is in accordance with State law regarding open containers of alcohol on public right of ways. The Big Yellow Bike would be expected to operate following the same rules stated for bicycles under City ordinance. There is no process for permitting or licensing bicycles at this time, so there are no requirements for insurance, rates, or other regulations outside of what is stated in the ordinance.

It is recommended that the company consider placing the orange triangle sign on the back of the vehicle that many around Iowa know as the "slow moving vehicle" sign. Traffic and Transportation, along with the Police Department, have requested to review proposed routes for any traffic operations or safety related impacts, as the multipassenger bike will be operating well below the posted speed limit on downtown streets.

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




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
Route # 2.26 Miles


