STAFF REPORT

Pursuant to Roll Call 13-0136 which was approved on January 28, 2013, the City Council referred a request to the Plan and Zoning Commission to consider a zoning text amendment regarding the definition of "small engine repair".

On February 13, 2013 the Regulation and Ordinance (R&O) subcommittee of the Plan and Zoning Commission recommended that the following definition be prepared for public hearing by Plan and Zoning Commission:

Small engine means a motor used to power home tools and equipment including generators, lawnmowers and other outdoor power tools producing an average output that ranges around 25 horsepower, which is usually powered by gasoline and that varies in size, shape and compression process depending on its configuration.

The proposed definition would be added to Section 134-3 of the City Code. In addition, the list of permitted uses for the C-1, Neighborhood Retail Commercial District (Section 134-842) would be amended to specifically reference small engine repair shops.

II. ADDITIONAL APPLICABLE INFORMATION

Staff contacted DMACC for input regarding the proposed definition of a small engine. DMACC representatives indicated they do not have a "small engine" certification program and did not offer any changes to the proposed definition.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Municipal Code of the City of Des Moines, Iowa, 2000, adopted by Ordinance No. 13,827, passed June 5, 2000, as heretofore amended, is hereby amended by amending Sections 134-3 and 134-842, relating to the regulation of lawn mower and small engine repair shops.

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Des Moines, Iowa:

Section 1. That the Municipal Code of the City of Des Moines, Iowa, 2000, adopted by Ordinance No. 13,827, passed June 5, 2000, as heretofore amended, is hereby amended by amending Section 134-3 to add a definition for "small engine", and by amending paragraph (vv) of subsection (2) of Section 134-842, relating to the regulation of lawn mower and small engine repair shops, as follows:

Sec. 134-3. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Small engine means a motor used to power tools, professional tools, and equipment including generators, lawnmowers and other outdoor power tools producing an average output that ranges around 25 horsepower, which is usually powered by gasoline and that varies in size, shape and compression process depending on its configuration.

Sec. 134-842. Principal permitted uses.

Only the following uses of structures or land shall be permitted in the C-1 neighborhood retail commercial district.

- (1) Any use permitted in and as limited in the C-0 and R-4 districts.
- (2) Retail business or service establishments such as the following:
 - vv. Lawn mower <u>and small engine</u> repair shops, provided that any runup or testing of engines shall take place within the shop building.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law. FORM APPROVED:
