Regarding: The proliferation of large, unsightly business signage, billboards, and digital display boards that line commercial corridors in Des Moines. Board members from the Beavertdale, Lower Beaver, Meredith, and Merle Hay neighborhood associations have approved the following resolution:

"The Beavertdale, Lower Beaver, Meredith and Merle Hay neighborhood associations are concerned by the proliferation of large, unsightly business signage and billboards along and in the vicinity of vital commercial corridors such as Merle Hay Road, Hickman Road, Douglas Avenue, Euclid Avenue, and Beaver Avenue. Collectively, these large signs, digital boards of all sizes, and billboards cheapen the appearance of commercial corridors, which adversely impacts surrounding residential areas. We request that the Des Moines City Council enact a moratorium on the construction of new business signage, digital boards, or billboards, or alteration of any of the aforementioned, until regulations are enacted to adequately address these problems."
