CITY OF DES MOINES PIANO IN RIGHT-OF-WAY LICENSE POLICY

Policy

It is the policy of the City of Des Moines, Iowa, that the City Engineer or designee is authorized to issue piano licenses for placement of a piano on the right of way subject to the base conditions listed below and such other additional requirements as may be deemed advisable by the City Engineer with respect to a specific location.

Piano License conditions and requirements:

- A. Use is limited from May 1 to October 31;
- B. License agreement to provide insurance coverage as required by the City Engineer and Risk Manager in accordance with Municipal Code Section 102-612;
- C. License agreement to provide for indemnification of the City in accordance with Municipal Code Section 102-611;
- D. No sale, transfer, or assignment of the piano license agreement without written consent of the City;
- E. The location of the piano, including the bench, must be approved by the City Engineer and shall not interfere with access to public or City utilities located and/or operated within the City's right of way and shall comply with the criteria set forth in Municipal Code Section 102-607;
- F. No sign or advertisement is allowed on the piano except for a sign identifying the sponsor(s) of the piano. No solicitation for consideration by any means is allowed;
- G. Every day the piano must be securely covered from ten-thirty (10:30) p.m. to ten o'clock (10:00) a.m. unless otherwise designated by the City Engineer or designee in the license. When uncovered the piano must be available for use by all members of the public;
- H. The piano shall be securely anchored to the right of way. The anchoring system must be approved by the City Engineer or designee. Applicant shall be responsible for all damage to the right of way caused by the anchoring or placement of the piano. A deposit in an amount determined by the City Engineer or designee shall be required prior to placement of the anchoring system and shall be returned when the sidewalk is restored to its prior condition;
- I. The applicant shall be solely responsible for the piano and any and all damage to the piano. The applicant shall also adhere to such additional requirements as may be deemed advisable by the City Engineer with respect to a specific location.

The City Engineer or designee may grant the license if the applicant has fully completed the application in accordance with Municipal Code Section 102-606, signed the license agreement to include the requirements for indemnification, a certificate of insurance, compliance with the requirements of this policy, and paying the deposit and required license amount of \$50 per location and a \$100 application fee.
