The Honorable Mayor and Members of the City Council,

RE: Recertification of Recognized Neighborhoods, 2017.

The Neighborhood Revitalization Board (NRB) is pleased to recommend recertification of 50 neighborhoods as 'Recognized' neighborhoods of the City of Des Moines. As part of the City's Neighborhood Recognition Policy, the City 'recertifies' Recognized neighborhoods that are in compliance with the annual survey and the requirements of the Neighborhood Recognition Policy. This year the annual survey was mailed via paper and digital format on March 10, 2017. Staff received completed surveys from all 51 Recognized neighborhoods.

ACCENT neighborhood asked to no longer be Recognized since they are unable to get members to serve on the Neighborhood Association Board. The NRB's recommendation from the June 7, 2017 public meeting regarding ACCENT neighborhood was forwarded to City Council for final action. On June 26, 2017, the City Council voted to suspend ACCENT neighborhood from the list of Recognized neighborhoods for six months, to give the Neighborhood Association additional time to reorganize.

At our meeting on July 5, 2017, the NRB discussed recertifying 50 Recognized neighborhoods. These neighborhoods have demonstrated good standing and meet the requirements of the annual survey and the Neighborhood Recognition Policy. A motion to recertify was voted on and approved by the NRB.
