Christine Hensley has served as a Des Moines City Council woman for 24 years. She has had a hand in \$2.5 billion worth of projects in the city. She has been a champion of regional and downtown service developments.

She wanted to be a Council person to help make a difference and : she certainly has. In a recent <u>Business Record</u> article Chris spoke of those improvements she helped guide into existence that she is most proud of -- the Sculpture Park, Western Gateway, the East Village, Gray's Lake, booming area south of MLK Parkway, Ingersoll Ave.; 42nd Streetscape, 6th Ave. Corridor, MacRae Park--and the Trail System (that barely had begun when she took office) ranks toward the top.

I have been privileged to be Ghris's appointee to the Parks and Recreation Board for the past thirteen years. I I have worked closely with her on many park projects (as well as other city endeavors), Chris is such an advocate of public-private partnerships, which has certainly helped bolster our park amenities. She has such a remarkable ability to bring the right people together--the right fit for each endeavor. Now as she has decided to step away from the City Council at the end of her term, I feel it is a perfect opportunity to name something in the park system in her honor.

On our City Council-Park Board annual Parks Bus Tour just a week ago when asked what park projects had been her favorites, she narrowed the field a bit. She began with Gray's Lake and the belief she had it would work as a catalyst for park usage and as a hub for the Trail System.

I suggest the terrace at Gray's Lake be named the Christine Hensley Terrace Pavilion -- a perfect spot that overlooks both the lake with its trails and the city skyline that showcases the "cranes" and development in downtown Des Moines.
