



1. Howe Elementary sidewalks (shown in pink, as green are included in 2019 projects). This is a vastly underserved school area and will provide necessary safety for students and families immediately. Further, a planned park at Weeks will be connected to the residential neighborhood.



2. Hubbell Avenue from relocated East Douglas to E 3rd. This connects the new sidewalks along Hubbell, which abruptly ends, to business center, parks, schools and amenities.



3. Hickman Road (request from Merle Hay NA). Connecting citizens to the new Hy Vee Fast and Fresh and to Hillis Elementary. Further, to the closest park (Tower) and Library (Franklin).
