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AN ORDINANCE to amend the Municipal Code of the City of Des Moines, Iowa, 2000, adopted by Ordinance No. 13,827, passed June 5, 2000, as heretofore amended, by amending Chapter 74, Article IV, Sections 74-92, 74-97, 74-100, 74-101, Article V, Sections 74-176, 74-177, 74-178, 74-179, 74-181, 74-182, 74-183, 74-184, 74-186, 74-188, and Article VI, Section 74-210, regulating parks and recreational facilities, fees, and mobile food vendors in designated parks.

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Des Moines, Iowa:

Section 1. That the Municipal Code of the City of Des Moines, Iowa, 2000, adopted by Ordinance No. 13,827, passed June 5, 2000, as heretofore amended, is hereby amended, by amending Chapter 74, Article IV, Sections 74-92, 74-97, 74-100, 74-101, Article V, Sections 74-176, 74-177, 74-178, 74-179, 74-181, 74-182, 74-183, 74-184, 74-186, 74-188, and Article VI, Section 74-210, regulating parks and recreational facilities, fees, and mobile food vendors in designated parks, as follows:

#### **ARTICLE IV. Facilities**

## Sec. 74-92. Consumption of alcohol; intoxication.

- (a) It is unlawful for any person to use, possess or consume beer, wine or alcoholic liquor in any city park, including all park roads and parking areas in parks, except <u>in accordance</u> with all federal, state and local laws and by issuance of a permit or pursuant to a concession agreement and either:
  - (1) Approval of the parks and recreation board; or
  - (2) Such use, possession or consumption is within an enclosed park shelter; or
  - (3) Such use, possession or consumption is within the Clare and Miles Mills Rose Garden, Sylvan Theater, or the Lilac Arboretum or the Gray's Lake Park Christine Hensley Terrace and Terrace building and designated outdoor areas; or
  - (4) Such use, possession or consumption is within specified areas of the Principal Riverwalk including the Hub Spot Plaza, Hub Spot River Plaza, Hub Spot Building, Long Look Garden, Brenton Skating Plaza and plaza adjacent to World Food Prize building; or
  - (5)—Such use, possession or consumption is within the Robert D. Ray Asian Garden; or
  - (65) Such use, possession or consumption is during an adult event at the Carney Softball, James W. Cownie Soccer and Baseball Parks, or George Davis Softball Park. Such use, possession or consumption is allowed at within the fields and stands at Carney

- <u>Softball Park</u>, James W. Cownie Soccer Park <u>and Baseball Park</u>, Savage Softball <u>Fields at Easttown Park Complex</u>, and George Davis Softball Park <u>when said park facilities are in use for adult events and except when other fields at said park facilities are in use for youth events; or</u>
- (76) Such use, possession or consumption is within the park between Tenth and Fifteenth Streets and Grand Avenue and Locust Street a/k/a "Western Gateway Park"; or
- (<u>§7</u>) Within Riverview Park or in conjunction with the Prairie Meadows Riviera Amphitheater at Riverview Park.
- (b) The permit must be obtained from the parks and recreation director or his or her designee.
- (c) Use, possession or consumption of beer or wine is allowed pursuant to a concession agreement covering:
  - (1) Gray's Lake Park Christine Hensley Terrace and Terrace building and designated outdoor areas; or
  - (21) Birdland Marina service building and designated outdoor areas.
- (d) In addition to the above requirements, a state liquor control license and approval of the parks and recreation board is required in order to use, possess or consume keg beer or alcoholic liquor, except that parks and recreation board approval is not required for use, possession or consumption within "Western Gateway Park," Birdland Marina and Christine Hensley Terrace and Terrace building and designated outdoor areas.
- (e) No person shall be intoxicated or simulate intoxication in a city park.

# Sec. 74-97. Lakes and ponds.

No person shall throw or place any foreign or waste substance in any lake, pond or swimming beach in any public park. Boats are not permitted in lakes and ponds, with the exception of Gray's Lake, without the permission of the parks and recreation director. No person shall fish from or dangle any object from the Gray's Lake watercraft rental dock, the Gray's Lake swimming beach, or the Gray's Lake pedestrian bridges or any pedestrian bridges in any city parks.

# Sec. 74-100. Park facility hours.

The hours of operation for all public parks, community recreation centers, aquatic centers, pools, wading pools, splash pools, and spray-grounds, and city recreational facilities, except for the Greater Des Moines Botanical Garden, A. H. Blank Park Zoo, Principal Park, and Prairie Meadows Riviera Amphitheater at Riverview Park-and Brenton Skating Plaza and support pavilion, shall be established by the Des Moines parks and recreation board by vote at one board meeting. The parks and recreation director shall thereafter have authority to adjust such hours, for a period of one season, unless otherwise directed by the Des Moines parks and recreation board. The hours of the Brenton Skating Plaza and support pavilion shall be established by the parks and recreation director. For the purposes of this section, "one season" shall mean the first weekend in April

through the last weekend in October and the Monday following the last weekend of October up to the first weekend in April.

- (a) No person shall remain in any public park, community recreation center or recreational facility during the periods of time set by this section unless special permission shall have been given by the parks and recreation director for such persons or group of persons to remain there. Such permit shall not allow use of the park for more than two (2) hours prior to its opening time or more than two (2) hours after its closing time, unless issued in compliance with section 74-101.
- (b) No person shall remain in or on any city park, inclusive of municipal golf courses, from 10:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.
- (c) Exceptions are made for:
  - (1) Clubhouses and related facilities on golf courses. These facilities may remain open until 2:00 a.m.
  - (2) Concerts at the Simon Estes <u>Riverfront Amphitheater</u>. This facility may remain open until 12:00 <u>a.m.</u> (midnight).
  - (3) Prairie Meadows Riviera Amphitheater at Riverview Park.- This facility may remain open until 12:00 <u>a.m.</u> (midnight).
  - (4) Birdland Marina. This facility may remain open until 11:00 p.m.
  - (5) Brenton Skating Plaza. This facility may remain open until 12:00 a.m. (midnight).
  - (6) Western Gateway Park and John and Mary Pappajohn Sculpture Park. This facility may remain open until 12:00 a.m. (midnight).
  - (7) Gray's Lake Park. This facility may remain open from 6:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. from November 1-March 31 and from 5:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. from April 1-October 31.
  - (8) Principal Riverwalk (excluding trails and trail heads which follow multi-use recreational trails hours, and Rotary Riverwalk Park which follows standard park hours): These facilities may remain open until 2:00 a.m.
  - (9) *Multi-use recreational trails*. These facilities shall be open at all times.
  - (10) James W. Cownie Soccer Park, James W. Cownie Baseball Park, George Davis Softball Park, Savage Softball <u>Fields at Easttown Park—Complex</u> and Carney Softball <u>Complex Park</u>. These facilities may be open until 12:00 <u>a.m.</u> (midnight).

# Sec. 74-101 Overnight use of parks by special permit.

- (a) Purpose. The city's parks and park facilities were are not designed for unlimited overnight use. The unlimited use of city parks after hours of operation, such as for camping or storage of personal property, interferes with the rights of others to use the parks for the recreational, leisure and environmental purposes for which they were are intended. The purpose of this section is to allow the city's parks to be maintained in a clean and accessible condition and to protect the health, safety and welfare of the city and its residents, while recognizing that infrequent overnight use, subject to reasonable conditions, can be beneficial to the recreational, cultural or educational needs of the community.
- (b) For the purpose of this section, overnight use shall mean remaining in or being in a park during hours when the park is not open for operation. Overnight use does not include storage of equipment, vehicles, or buildings or structures as defined in chapter 134 of this Code, which:

- (1) is intended for use and is used during the hours of operation of the park; and
- (2) is not intended or used for sleeping or residing; and
- does not remain in the park for more than fourteen (14) consecutive days.
- (c) The city parks and areas within such park in which overnight use is permitted and the conditions on such use, including camping, may be established by the parks and recreation director with the consultation of the parks and recreation board. Overnight use shall be allowed only by permit issued by the director. No more than ten (10) days of overnight use per calendar year per park shall be allowed. No person shall be permitted overnight use of a city park for more than three (3) days per calendar year per park, unless permitted by the city manager for a compelling recreational, cultural or educational need of the community. Commercially manufactured tents designed for no more than eight (8) persons may be permitted with overnight use of a park, although no other buildings or structures as defined in chapter 134 of this Code or which are regulated by chapters 26 or 42 of this Code shall be allowed for overnight use.
- (d) Overnight use of the cabin at Ewing Park shall be exempt from the calendar year day limits of this section.
- (e) Overnight use of the parks for city sponsored or hosted events, activities, and programs shall be exempt from the requirements of this section.
- (f) Moorage at the Birdland Marina pursuant to a rental agreement shall be exempt from the requirements of this section.

- (a) *Scope.* Fees for use of city ball diamonds and soccer fields shall be as provided in this section.

- (4) *Pool rental* for athletic programs and practices. \$75.00/hour for a minimum of two (2) hours. This fee includes \$50.00 per hour for pool use plus \$25.00 per hour for a minimum of two lifeguards.
- (5) Swim meets. \$500.00/day, maximum of 12 hours. This fee includes exclusive use for a single facility; the City will provide lifeguards.
- (b) Birdland Marina moorage fees. All moorage fees include tax. Official mMoorage season allowed annually is from March 15 through—November 15. All rentals are based on availability and are as follows:
  - (1) Seasonal Double access \$630550.00
  - (2) Seasonal Single access \$550<del>500</del>.00
  - (3) *Monthly, single access only* \$165.00

#### Sec. 74-188. Miscellaneous.

- (a) Commercial photography or video permits issued per Section 74-109: Per day \$10.00.
- (b) Permits for special lighting on facilities equipped with programmable multi-colored L.E.D lighting features: \$150.00 per 24-hour period per facility, from sunset to sunrise the following day.

- (1) Facilities include the Chris and Marcie Coleman Bridge, the Ruan Connector, <u>and</u> the Women of Achievement Bridge and the stage at Prairie Meadows Riviera Amphitheater at Riverview Park. Additional facilities may be added if equipped with programmable multi-colored L.E.D. lighting features, subject to approval of the city manager.
- (2) Permits are subject to approval of the parks and recreation director and must promote the city, its civic institutions, state and federal holidays, and other public events of community significance per applicant.
- (3) <u>Each applicant may request up to two permits per calendar year. Each Ppermits shall be are limited to no more than three (3) consecutive total days and one (1) a single color scheme request for no more than six (6) total days per calendar year.</u>

#### ARTICLE VI. MOBILE FOOD VENDERS IN DESIGNATED PARKS

#### Sec. 74-210. Mobile Food Venders and Transient Merchants.

This article is being adopted as a pilot project for a limited duration, after which the city council will determine whether to repeal this article or to make changes to this article, as appropriate.

- (a) Mobile venders operating mobile vender vehicles, as defined in article V of chapter 78 of this Code, and transient merchants, as defined in article III of chapter 78 of this Code, may be located or operated only in the following parks:
  - (1)—Greenwood Park.
  - (2) Ashworth Park.
  - (3) Union Park.
  - (4) Grandview Park.
  - (5) Ewing Park.
  - (6) MacRae Park.
  - (7)—Simon Estes Amphitheater Plaza.
  - (8) Evelyn K. Davis Park.
  - (9) Riverview Park.
  - (1) Ashworth Park
  - (2) Evelyn K. Davis Park
  - (3) Ewing Park
  - (4) Grandview Park
  - (5) Greenwood Park
  - (6) MacRae Park
  - (7) Riverview Park
  - (8) Simon Estes Amphitheater Plaza
  - (9) Union Park
- (b) Mobile vender vehicles and transient merchant push carts, structures, and vehicles may only be located in a parking space designated by a sign for mobile food venders within the paved parking lot or park road. Use of such designated parking spaces are on a first-come-first-serve basis each day. No other parking space or parking on unpaved areas within the parks may be used for mobile vender vehicles or transient

- merchant push carts, structures, or vehicles. Mobile venders and transient merchants are not allowed to place any items within the park, other than the mobile vender vehicle, such as tables or chairs.
- (c) Mobile vender vehicles and transient merchant push carts, structures, and vehicles are only allowed in the above-designated parks during the days of the year when permanent restrooms are open to the public in such parks and only during hours when the park is open to the public.
- (d) Every mobile food vender operating or locating a mobile vender vehicle within the designated parks must have a current mobile vender license issued in compliance with article V of chapter 78 of this Code and operate in compliance with all license and article V of chapter 78 requirements. Every transient merchant operating or locating a push cartpushcart, structure, or vehicle within the designated parks must have a current transient merchant license issued in compliance with article III of chapter 78 of this Code and operate in compliance with all license and article III of chapter 78 requirements.
- (e) Every mobile food vender and transient merchant operating or locating a mobile vender vehicle within the above designated parks must have a mobile food vender or transient permit issued by the parks and recreation director. An application for such permit must be made by submitting an application form provided by the department at least three (3) business days prior to use. The application must include a copy of the applicant's mobile vender or transient merchant license issued by the city clerk and payment of the application fee of \$200 for an annual permit or \$25 per day for a 1-day permit. Annual permits shall be in effect for one year, or portion thereof, from April 1 through October 31 of each year and are in effect only during the time periods when the requirements of subsection (d) above are met. The parks and recreation director may designate dates within the permit period during which mobile venders are prohibited from operating within the designated parks.
- (f) The permit must be displayed within the mobile vender vehicle or on the transient merchant push carts, structures, and vehicles in a manner such that it is readily visible to all persons seeking to conduct business with the mobile vender.
- (g) Upon complaint or a reasonable suspicion that a permittee or the permittee's employees or agents has furnished any false information in its application or has violated or failed to comply with any of the requirements of this article or chapter 78 of this Code, or any other provisions of this Code, the suspension or revocation provisions in section 78-73 or 78-211 of this Code, as applicable, shall apply, with the parks and recreation director or director's designee in substitution for the city clerk or city clerk's designee.
- (h) Section 74-178 does not apply to mobile venders or transient merchants.
- (i) Notwithstanding subsection 74-210(a) above, pushcarts as defined in Section 78-61 of this Code may be located or operated at The Hub Spot pursuant to a concession agreement approved by the city council and at any city park during a city sponsored event pursuant to a temporary concession permit issued by the director. The requirements of subsection 74-210(b), (c), (d), (e), (f) and (g) above shall not apply to such pushcart operation.
- (j) Notwithstanding subsection 74-210(a) above, up to two <u>total</u> mobile venders operating mobile vender vehicles, as defined in article V of chapter 78 of this code,

and/or transient merchants, as defined in article III of chapter 78 of this code, push earts, structures, or vehicles licensed under article III or V of chapter 78 may be located or operated in Birdland Marina within the concession area pursuant to a concession agreement approved by resolution of the city council.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
