The main structure on the real estate legally described as The South 114 feet of the West 147 feet of Lot 14 and the West 147 feet of Lot 13, all in OSCEOLA, an Official Plat, now included in and forming a part of the City of Des Moines, Polk County, Iowa, and locally known as 1601 E 29th Street, has previously been declared a public nuisance;

The City Legal Department is hereby authorized to file an action in district court to obtain a decree ordering the abatement of the public nuisance, and should the owner(s) fail to abate the nuisance, as ordered, that the matter may be referred to the Department of Engineering which will take all necessary action to demolish and remove said structure.
