**SET PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE STATUS OF FUNDED ACTIVITIES (SOFA) FOR  
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FUNDS TO PREPARE FOR, PREVENT,  
AND RESPOND TO CORONAVIRUS (CDBG-CV), AS PASSED THROUGH THE IOWA  
ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (IEDA)**

**WHEREAS**, on March 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), was signed into law, which provides additional Community Development Block Grant (CDBG-CV) and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG-CV) funding to prepare for, prevent, and respond to coronavirus; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 11, 2020, the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) announced the availability of a second round of \$1 billion in CDBG-CV funds for states which allows them to fund activities in entitlement areas; and

**WHEREAS**, HUD allocated \$9,529,120 in CDBG-CV 2 funds to the State of Iowa to be administered by the Iowa Economic Development Authority ("IEDA"); and

**WHEREAS**, IEDA chose a methodology for funding entitlement cities based on population and a standard factor and allocated \$2,067,124 CDBG-CV 2 funds to the City of Des Moines; and

**WHEREAS**, the City has expended its initial CDBG-CV allocation from the State and has received an additional \$456,000 for shelter operations and activity delivery costs; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with instructions from IEDA and 24 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 91 Subpart B, an entitlement jurisdiction receiving CDBG-CV funding, such as the City of Des Moines, must follow its citizen participation procedures and provide citizens with a reasonable opportunity to comment on federally-funded activities; and

**WHEREAS**, HUD has issued several regulatory waivers and suspensions for federally-funded programs, including Consolidated Plan and citizen participation requirements in 24 CFR 91, in conjunction with the CARES Act; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 13, 2020, HUD acknowledged the City of Des Moines' intent to waive 1) the citizen participation 30-day public comment period for Consolidated Plan amendments to no less than five days and 2) citizen participation reasonable notice and opportunity to comment in the city's citizen participation plan; and

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary, by public hearing following notice, to obtain the views of residents regarding community development and housing needs and to provide a forum for residents to comment on the City's CDBG-CV activities; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 508 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1987, as amended, requires local governments to comply with the State of Iowa's Citizen Participation Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of Iowa's Citizen Participation Plan includes a public hearing requirement on the Status of Funded Activities (SOFA) when the project is at 50 percent completion.



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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of Des Moines, Iowa, that:

1. A public hearing to obtain the views of citizens regarding the Status of Funded Activities (SOFA) for CDBG-CV 2 funded projects shall be held on January 26, 2026 at 5:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers, City Hall, 400 Robert D. Ray Drive, Des Moines, Iowa.
2. The notice of hearing on file with the City Clerk as Exhibit "A" and by this reference made a part hereof, is hereby approved, and the City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this notice in the Des Moines Register on January 16, 2026.
